All people of Faith are cordially invited to celebrate the congregation's 75th anniversary of ministry and presence in Shelton, Washington.

Join us on Sunday, April 21, 2024, at 10:00am for a service of worship and praise led by the Geddes and the rest of the Celebration Team.

At 11:30am, make your way to the Fellowship Hall for a catered buffet dinner. Around 12:30pm we will have a brief program with humor, music, stories, special guests, and a group photo.

During the celebration, from 11:30 to 1:30, a photo booth hosted by Cooper Studios will be set up in the Three Door Room, where you can receive a free 4x6 portrait to commemorate the 75th anniversary of Faith. These portraits will also be used for a special picture directory which will be published later in the year.

No RSVP is required—there will be plenty for all. Most of the cost of this event is being covered by special donations. If you would like to offset some of the costs of this event, a free will offering will be available, or you can make a special donation in the church office (include "75th Anniversary" on your check or statement).

Faith hopes to have more events during the year to celebrate 75 years of God's faithfulness. Plans are in the works for a picture directory; a 75th anniversary memorial plaque; and all new signs both inside and outside the building and on the roadsides.

Merciful Father, we offer with joy and thanksgiving what you have first given us our selves, our time, and our possessions, signs of your gracious love. Receive them for the sake of him who offered himself for us, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen (Lutheran Book of Worship, p. 67).

This is one of my favorite prayers in worship. It is an "Offertory," traditionally spoken as the ushers bring the filled offering plates down the center aisle to be placed at the altar.

We haven't been "passing the plates" during worship for a few years now. During the pandemic, most people began to send in offerings via mail or EFT. Even when we were together in worship, we looked for ways to protect our more vulnerable neighbors (remember the little pre-sealed communion cups?).

We adapted. We installed the "OTM" in the back of the sanctuary (Offerings, Tithes, and Messages). Giving levels stayed where they had been, and it even shaved a couple of minutes off the length of the service on Sunday mornings. Maybe "passing the plates" was just a vestige of the past, gone the way of Latin, communion registration, and kneeling at the altar.

But something is missing—something is missed—when we don't pass the plate. After all, bringing an offering to the Lord is at the heart of the practice of worship. There is something sacred about receiving the plate from a neighbor on one side; handing the plate to the neighbor on the other side. A glance is exchanged. A smile. A tear. A child is learning how to give, proudly placing her quarters in among the envelopes, welcome cards, and \$20 bills. A pillar of the church ages, so the next generation steps up to usher, tithe, and teach.

We give Thee but Thine own, we sing, whate'er the gift may be: all that I have is Thine alone, a trust, O Lord, from Thee.

Faith is a generous, faithful, giving congregation. You give your tithes and offerings out of gratitude for God's provision; in obedience to God's word; and to bless and care for a world in need. Faith is also a fiscally responsible organization. We are debt free. We pay our bills. We pay fair wages. We live within our means. I am grateful to the congregation for its generous financial support and to the Council for its good stewardship of that which is given.

Faith has been passing the plate, giving, sharing, and managing God's resources since 1949. Later this month, on April 21, we are going to splurge on ourselves and throw a little party to commemorate our 75th anniversary as a congregation. Take a look at the enclosed invitation, and plan to enjoy some time together with plenty of food, stories, music, flowers, and even a photo booth to celebrate God's faithfulness "in ages past and years to come."

And while we're at it, maybe it is time to start passing the plates again. Maybe not EVERY Sunday, but regularly enough to get back into the practice of bringing our gifts, teaching our children, and seeing our neighbors.

NEW STAFF, FAMILIAR FACES




DOMINICAN REPUBLIC SCHOOL MINISTRY
